Dear Friends and Supporters,

Exciting news in the midst of the pandemic. Thanks to your on-going support and some added help from donors able to help in a hurry, the Conservancy was able to purchase a total of **3 key parcels in the Anderson Meadow.**

During late fall, we were able to purchase the 'center cut' of Anderson Meadow...250' of waterfront wetland and the 40 acres immediately behind it as well as another 20 acres of timbered snow and rain saving upland drainage behind it.

Then in early spring we were able to purchase the 150' treed waterfront western piece of Anderson meadow and 3 parcels behind it which we have fought to prevent being developed over the past 25 years. Now it will be preserved permanently to help cleanse and protect our lake.
